




Story Starts with a Prophesy?


- Yogananda born 1893 in India.
- His parents followed a Hindu guru named Lahiri Mahasaya.
- Lahiri said to have prophesied over Yogananda when he was a nursing infant that he would not only become a yogi like himself, but that he would be a chosen catalyst for bringing Hinduism to the West.

In his best-selling *Autobiography* of a Yogi, Yogananda chronicles his spiritual quest of seeking and finding his guru Yukteswar Giri (1855-1936) in India, and how he learned to master the Hindu religion to become a yogi guru himself.









Wealthy Convert

 James Lynn (1892-1955), a wealthy oil and insurance tycoon became a convert and bankrolled the first Self-Realization Fellowship center in Los Angeles in 1925.

 Ten years later, Lynn purchased the thirty-five-acre beachfront property in Encinitas, built a hermitage and temple—all while Yogananda was away in India—and gave it to Yogananda as a surprise gift upon his return.


Now there are over 500 meditation centers in 25 countries.







- Taught in community centers, public schools, business seminars, malls.



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
Paramahansa's Teaching







But what he brought was really **Hinduism** repackaged using Christian words.

God

"Every grain of food you eat, every breath you take, is God."

(Scientific Healing Affirmations, K882)


"Self-realization is the knowing in all parts of body, mind, and soul that you are now in possession of the kingdom of God; that you do not have to pray that it come to you; that God's omnipresence is your omnipresence; and that all that you need to do is improve your knowing."

- Pantheism: God is all and all is God
- Everything, including people, and even the matter of the universe, is divine.



Creation

- God (Spirit) individualized itself through "vibratory activity" to create this world much like the rays of light from a projector are individualized onto a movie screen.
- Pure Spirit created a universe in which it divided itself "into many souls that they may play with Me." (Journey to Self-Realization, 32)
- Just like a movie is not real, creation is not real. The entire universe is an illusion (maya).





Humans

- Man is also an illusion.
- Man's true essence is divine.
- Goal is for people is to recognize that their true nature is divine and that they are actually one with God.
- This is called "self-realization."

The Lotus Flowers around the Encinitas complex are illustrations of man realizing this divinity within.









Sin & Evil

- Ignorance is "the root-cause of all human maladies." (The Yoga of Jesus, K630)
- We're merely duped into thinking everything is real, including our pain.
- But "When we have finished seeing the motion picture, we know that nobody was killed; nobody was suffering." (Journey to Self-Realization, 20)
- There is really no sin, no evil, no disease, no disharmony, no separateness.
- Even Satan himself is an illusion (he is taught to be symbolic).
 Hell does not exist.






Jesus


- Jesus was an ordinary man who attained "Christ Consciousness."
- Jesus was just one of many sent to help mankind throughout history (there were many others including Krishna, Buddha, Yogananda and his gurus).
- Jesus did not die on the cross to provide salvation for our sins, but to be an example for us and show us the way to self-realization.





Salvation

- **Self-realization** (not forgiveness) is what we need.
- Our problem is **ignorance** of our divinity.
- We must follow the example of Jesus and become like Christ, resurrect the Christ within us, and attain "Christ Consciousness" for ourselves.
- The "second coming" of Jesus will be when the masses finally achieve this.



Kriya Yoga

- Most who practice yoga today are completely unaware it is an ancient Hindu practice aimed at producing "union" with God (yoga means "divine union").
- Yogananda taught that it would normally take the average person a million years to climb the upward path of spiritual evolution to achieve self-realization. However, using his yoga technique, it is taught that one can achieve this enlightenment in just three years' time.
- The key to Kriya Yoga, according to Yogananda, is that it is direct access to God. Other Hindu devotees seek reunification with God through personal deities (Brahma, Vishnu, Shiva, Krishna, etc.). But Yogananda taught it is far better (and faster) to have direct experience of God through yoga union.

This is how he said it works...


Medulla Oblongata

Per Yogananda, there is a point of contact between a person's divine spirit and a person's body. The medulla oblongata (which sits between the brain and the spinal cord) is where the contact occurs.

Following Hindu teaching, he said that during creation, divine Spirit energy moved at different vibratory rates. This resulted in Spirit individualizing itself into conscious thought, and then it further condensed to create matter, including our own bodies.

The medulla is the **doorway** through which the divine Spirit provided and continues to provide the energy and lifeforce of matter.

Using Kriya Yoga techniques, one learns to open this doorway not only to **commune** with the divine flow, but also to **release vibratory Spirit power** for healing of self and others.



Direct Experience with the Divine


Yogananda taught yoga was a way for people to have direct experience with the divine. Through it, "God can be known, not as a theological concept but as an actual personal <u>experience</u>." (Yoga of Jesus, Kindle 628, 629.)

The **divine intuition** that comes from meditation not only serves to make one aware of their divinity, but also acts as a type of **soul guidance**. (Yogananda, *The Yoga of Jesus*, Kindle 2420, 2421.)



Chanting and Affirmations

- Since ultimately mind (conscious Spirit) drives matter, the mind has power to <u>cure</u> diseases. One can concentrate the mind to consciously increase the supply of cosmic energy into a sick part of the body. It is said this can be done through positive affirmations made by the mind which reject the illusion of sickness.
- Some examples of affirmations from Yogananda are: "I am charming and magnetic, I am pleased with all; I wipe away all tears and fears. I have no enemy. I am the friend of all. I have no habits, In eating, thinking, behaving; I am free, I am free." (Scientific Healing Affirmations, Kindle 718-723)
- Affirmations can be made for anything: material success, social success, sexual purity and curing bad habits. Or, they can be made for healing things like eyes, stomach and teeth.



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Response to Pantheism

- The Bible repeatedly teaches there is only one God (Deut. 3:35,39; 6:4; 1 Chron. 17:20; Isa. 43:10,11; 44:6,8; 45:21).
- One example: "For I am God, and there is none else; I am God, and there is none like me." (Isaiah 46:9).
- God is distinct from his creation (Isaiah 55:8-9). God is omnipotent (all-powerful) and omnipresent (everywhere at once) while his creatures are not.



What the Bible says about Sin & Evil

- The Bible says we have a serious sin problem.
- The Bible records the Fall of mankind in Genesis 2. Prior to the Fall everything was declared by God to be "good." But after the Fall, the earth became cursed (Gen. 3:17). Sin and death entered the world through Adam and Eve's sinful choice to disobey God (Rom. 5:12).
- The purpose for Jesus coming as Savior was to atone for man's sin (Jn. 1:29; 1 Jn. 2:2; 1 Jn. 4:10; Isa. 53:4-5) and provide reconciliation (Col. 1:20-22) back to God through faith in Jesus' finished work on the cross (Rom. 5:1; Rom. 6:23).
- This is the only way to enjoy fellowship with God (John 14:6).





Response to Karma & Reincarnation

- Karma. The bible does not speak of an impersonal law of karma governing the universe. But there is one God who will hold all people accountable. All people "will give account to him who is ready to judge the living and the dead." (1 Pet. 4:5)
- Reincarnation. The Bible says, "it is appointed for man to die once, and after that comes judgment..." (Heb. 9:27)
 It's very important for people to receive Jesus since they only live one lifetime.

Jesus & Salvation

Jesus. Jesus was not an ordinary man who became the Christ. 'Christ' was added to Jesus' name because he was the promised Messiah spoken of in the Old Testament. There is no "Christ Consciousness" which he attained that is available to all mankind.

• Salvation. Mankind cannot become 'god' by recognizing the divinity within. The lie that we could become gods is a lie from Satan which he used against Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden. This led to the Fall of mankind (Gen 3). It is also how Satan fell from being a holy angel to a demon (Isa. 14:12-14). Instead of exalting themselves, people need to recognize their need of salvation and receive the free gift of salvation offered by Christ upon the cross. All people need to be saved (1 Jn. 1:8-10; Rom. 3:10, 23; 6:23).



The Bible

Christians believe the below are clear examples of *eisegesis* (ignoring the plain, ordinary meaning of the text and inserting one's own meaning instead).

- Man shall live by the medulla oblongata. The familiar passage from Jesus' Temptation says, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God" (Mt. 4:4). Yogananda said the "mouth of God" refers to the medulla oblongata and the words that proceed from it "is life energy or cosmic vibratory force." (Scientific Healing Affirmations, Kindle 199-203) What we really need for living is not food alone but the life energy that comes from our medulla oblongata.
- Jesus said the light of the body is the "third eye." Matthew 6:22: "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light." Yogananda said this refers to a "third eye" that becomes visible during deep meditation, appearing in the middle of the forehead. This is a doorway into the presence of God. (Scientific Healing Affirmations, Kindle 1340-1344) If this "third eye" is healthy, then we are full of light.



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Things for Hindus to Ponder

Christians can offer the following suggestions to Hindus who are interested in learning more about Christianity.

- Jesus offers rest. Most Hindus are troubled by the idea of being hopelessly locked into a cycle of rebirth based on their actions—a cycle they
 cannot escape. Jesus said in Matthew 11:28-30: "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke
 upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For My yoke is easy and My burden is
 light."
- Why not study the words of Jesus for yourself? Hindus think highly of Jesus. Gandhi said, "I shall say to the Hindus that your lives will be
 incomplete unless you reverently study the teachings of Jesus." There are four Christian gospels which are very interesting to read. These
 can be read for free through many Bible apps or online.¹
- Consider the uniqueness of Jesus. At first glance, Hindus might not think Jesus is unique. However, each Hindu should read the gospel of John for themselves. They will quickly see how Jesus stands out among Hindu incarnation stories. For example, (1) there were at least ten incarnations of Vishnu; (2) historicity is not essential; (3) the purpose of Vishnu's incarnation was for destruction of evil-doers; and (4) the avatars pointed to a way to attain enlightenment over many lifetimes of striving zealously. In contrast, (1) Jesus had one incarnation in human form; (2) his historicity is essential; (3) his purpose was to seek and save the lost; and (4) he himself is the way people can freely receive eternal life immediately.

Important Hindu terms

Atman	Atman or the 'true self' is deep down inside our souls and this is Brahman.
Caste	Hindus believe all people are born into their caste based on karma. It is not possible to switch castes or marry outside one's caste. Four basic castes are: Brahmins, Vaishyas, Shudras, Dalits.
Dharma	The natural universal laws which must be observed to be happy and content. This Hindu word literally means 'religion.'
Enlightenment	The awareness that a person's true self is divine (Brahman).
Guru	A mentor or spiritual leader.
Karma	Actions in previous life determines effect of next life. Must accept suffering.
Liberation	Happens when a person breaks free from the cycle of rebirth through enlightenment.
Mantra	A phrase a person meditates on to invoke the powers of a deity, inviting it to enter them.
Maya	Everything else that is not Brahman is not real and called maya. Maya encompasses all physical objects, our feelings and emotions.
ОМ	OM is the mantra containing the 'primal vibrations' of the universe.
Swami	A religious teacher from a monastic order.
Reincarnation	Endless cycle of higher/lower lives (animals are lower, humans higher).
